

Parents Concerned With Educational Environement Of Special Education Son Larry and Kathy Breeden, long-time and those expectations were put in

residents of Lee County, are demanding that the Lee County Board of Education provide a different educational environment for their son Michael.

The Breedens have contacted the administration and the board of education about their concerns with a intellectual disabilities teacher They stressed in a letter addressed to Wendy Martin. Chairman of the board of education, the repeated verbal abuse, intimidation and harassment that Michael and his classmates have endured during the past school year

According to Kathy Breeden, at least one other parent had written a letter outlining her daughter's treatment by the same teacher

The Breedens stated that Michael should have every right not only as a student at Lee County High, but especially as a special education student to have a stable and positive environment capable of providing the positive reinforcement which special education students so desperately need and deserve. The Breedens further state that they do not believe that teacher is capable of providing that type of stable environment

In the letter addressed to the board chairman, they share their opinion that the administration of Lee County High School has failed miserably in its' duty to adequately document the teacher's mistreatment of special education students in her classes and that their son, Michael, will not benefit from attending her class

On June 12, Dr Robert A Clay, School Superintendent, informed Kathy Breeden in a letter that a conference had been held regarding Mrs Breeden's concern with the teacher's conduct in the classes that Michael attends. The conference was attended by Bill Sampson, high school principal, Marica Arnold, director of special education, and the teacher According to that letter, the teacher was given expectations for dealing with students during that conference


