He loved of fishing, reading the morning paper, riding in his truck, and most of all giving his "unique" creations to everyone he met. A brother, a husband and a father, grandfather, and greatgrandfather, but perhaps, most special, he was a World War II submarine veteran^t that fought to secure the freedom of our country. 52 submarines that are still on patrol".
